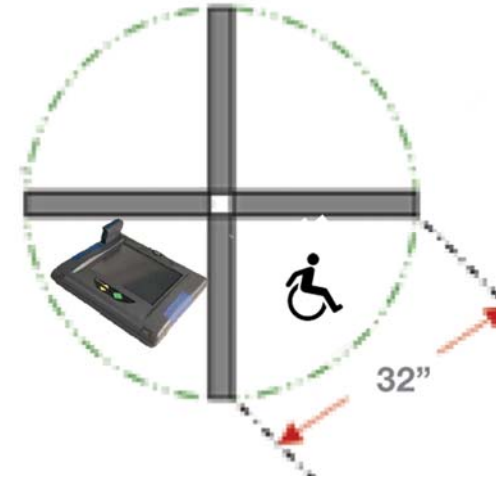
- Solves issues for voters with and without disabilities

Booth Normally Used for Paper Voting – but can also be used with Indiana Counties using Electronic Systems

- It can handle the rigors of many elections and storage

- Packs into a very small footprint (roughly the same as for a single booth)
- So small one can fit in the back of a car
- Saves warehouse and storage costs/space

- Setup is intuitive – but Flyer and Video available



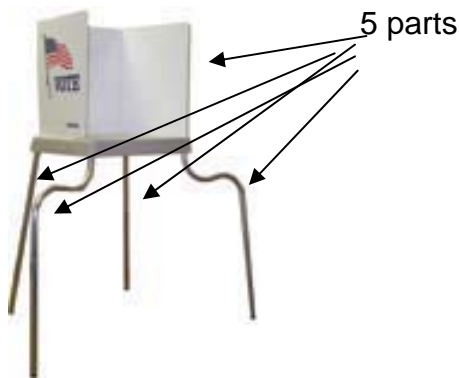

Single Booths

- With single booths, legs fall out, or can get misplaced
- Pollworkers and staff frustrated at lost parts
- Different configurations for “regular” and “handicapped” booths
- To create 40 voter stations, you would need 40 booths, each one with five separate pieces (1 table, 4 legs): 200 pieces total



PakFlatt Franklin

- Booths are all single integrated unit
- No pieces to lose
- No more aggravated pollworkers or warehouse staff
- To create 40 voter stations, you would need 10 booths: 10 pieces total!
- 1/20th the total number of parts

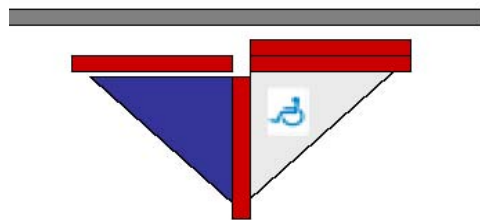

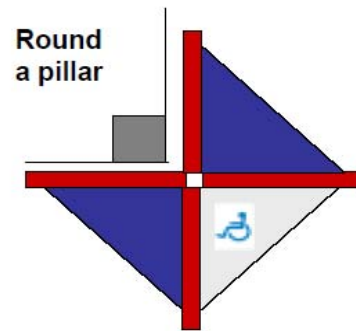
- Precincts in Indiana are configured differently

Set-up

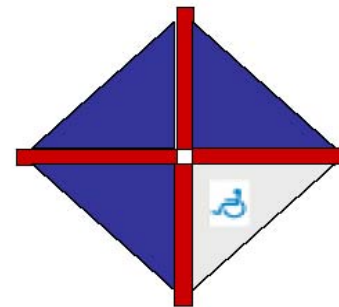


Against a wall

Indiana State Election Board:



“The Indiana Secretary of State will offer 55 grants on a first come, first-served basis. There will be 25 grants of \$5,000, 25 grants of \$10,000, and 5 grants of \$25,000, for a total of \$500,000. This process is intended to encourage counties to improve the accessibility of their polling places regardless of the number of precincts and make voting more accessible for the disabilities community”

\$5,000 Grant = 6 Booths



\$10,000 Grant = 12 Booths



\$25,000 Grant = 30 Booths
