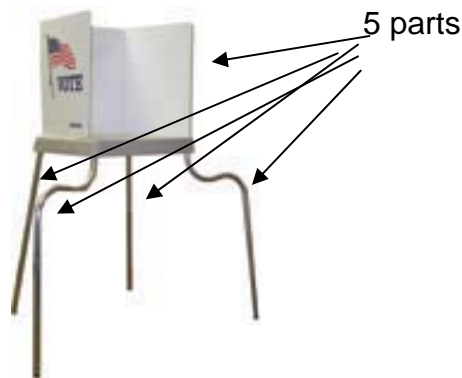

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Single Booths

- With single booths, legs fall out, or can get misplaced
- Pollworkers and staff frustrated at lost parts
- Different configurations for “regular” and “handicapped” booths
- To create 40 voter stations, you would need 40 booths, each one with five separate pieces (1 table, 4 legs): 200 pieces total



PakFlatt Franklin

- Booths are all single integrated unit
- No pieces to lose
- No more aggravated pollworkers or warehouse staff
- To create 40 voter stations, you would need 10 booths: 10 pieces total!
- 1/20th the total number of parts

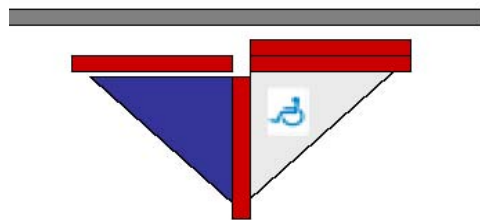


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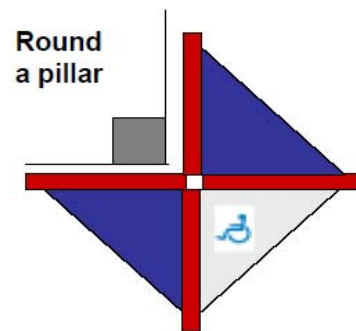
- Precincts in Oklahoma are configured differently

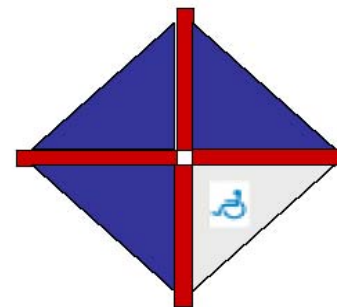

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Oklahoma State Election Board:

“There is federal money available for the purpose of improving the accessibility of polling places for voters with disabilities. Once you have determined what, if any, supplies or equipment you may need for your polling locations, please submit a list to Fran Roach, Pam Slater, or Suzanne Cox for approval. Once you have received approval, purchase the equipment using county funds and submit all documentation of the purchase to the State Election Board for reimbursement.”
